



Coyote Hollow Task Force Rules and Guidelines:

To the Coyote Hollow Task Force-

Thank you all for volunteering to serve. We appreciate your commitment to solving a difficult problem. As you move forward with this task, please keep the following in mind:

1. We would like this project to break ground in early spring 2019. Please plan the timeline accordingly.
2. This project will take input from all stakeholders- Parks, Trails and Recreation Committee (2-3), City Staff, (2-3), Police (1), and community members (3-5). Rhett Ogden, Parks and Recreation Director will assign task force members.
3. This has been a problem area for some time now, and there needs to be a solution. The task force may make adjustments, modifications, and improvements but it is our expectation that this task force come up with a real solution to the congestion and parking issues. We realize it may not be perfect but we expect a real plan be put in place and acted upon by September 30, 2018.
4. Task Force members can be removed and replaced at any time, if they are not working in a collegial and collaborative manner. The job of this task force is to create real solutions, not block progress. We need a group of reasonable people that want to work together to make the project run efficiently and smoothly.
5. The budget for this project is \$500,000. Please be respectful of the budget and plan accordingly; however, the priority is to finally resolve a longstanding issue. If you run into financial constraints, create a new proposal and bring it to us for further consideration.
6. Topics to be addressed by the task force are to include but are not limited to: traffic and congestion issues, safety issues, crime, ways to divert users to other areas, parking capacity and location, limiting use in off hours, enforcement, gated access control, proper lighting and video monitoring, etc.

Thank you again for volunteering to help with this issue and be a part of the solution. We truly appreciate your support.
