

RESOLUTION NO. 12-11

**A RESOLUTION OF THE DRAPER CITY COUNCIL ADOPTING THE POLICIES AND SUBSEQUENT FEES TO BE USED TO REGULATE TRAIL USE FOR PRIVATE (NON-CITY) EVENTS THAT UTILIZE DRAPER CITY TRAILS.**

**WHEREAS**, the Mayor and City Council wish to adopt a policies trail use in Draper City by outside agencies and private events with subsequent usage fees,

**WHEREAS**, the Council of Draper City finds it in the best interest of the City to protect City owned assets as well as re-coop actual costs of repair/maintenance/wear caused by participants of outside agency events; and,

**WHEREAS**, the City Council wishes to establish a fair and equal user fee for "exclusive use" rights to rent a publicly owned facility or hold a private event in Draper: and,

**WHEREAS**, the City Council hereby finds this action in the best interest of the public's health, safety and general welfare.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF DRAPER CITY, STATE OF UTAH, AS FOLLOWS:**

**Section 1.** Approval. The City Council hereby adopts the Trails Event Use Policy as shown in Exhibit "A" and the Trail Restrictions shown in Exhibit "B" attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference.

**Section 2.** Severability. If any section, part, or provision of this Resolution is held invalid, or unenforceable, such invalidity or unenforceability shall not affect any other portion of this Resolution, and all sections, parts, and provisions of this Resolution shall be severable..

**Section 3.** Effective Date. This Resolution shall become effective immediately upon adoption.



## Exhibit "A"

### DRAPER CITY TRAILS EVENT USE, MARCH 2012 FINAL DRAFT GENERAL EVENT INFORMATION, FEES AND RULES

#### No event may take place on Draper City Parks or Trails without a Trail Event Permit

1. To be considered, applicant must also obtain the general "Special Event" permit from Draper City (planning/zoning). These are two separate permits and both must be obtained prior to the event.
  - a. The Fee for Special Event Permits and Trail Event permits shall be as adopted in the Consolidated Fee Schedule.
  - b. Participant Fees for trails events utilizing all Corner Canyon trails and all primitive trails in Draper City and Participant Fees for trails events utilizing all hard surface/asphalt trails in Draper City shall be as adopted in the Consolidated Fee Schedule. The participant fee is to be collected and paid to the city after the conclusion of the event within 10 business days with an accounting of total participants entered. The deposit will not be released until all participant fees have been paid in full.
2. The applicant is responsible for providing a valid certificate of liability insurance as required by the Special Event Permit
3. The applicant is responsible for obtaining any necessary clearance or permissions for the use of intellectual property including but not limited to music or other performance rights for the event.
4. The Parks and Trails event permit or the Draper City Special Event does not grant applicant the permission to sell or offer sale of any food, tickets, merchandise, etc. at or near event location. This requires a separate application and will be part of the special event permit.
5. Event application must be submitted 4 weeks before the event and all payment of fees must be paid before a permit may be granted.

#### TRAILS EVENT POLICIES

The applicant must agree to the following rules prior to receiving a Trails Event Permit:

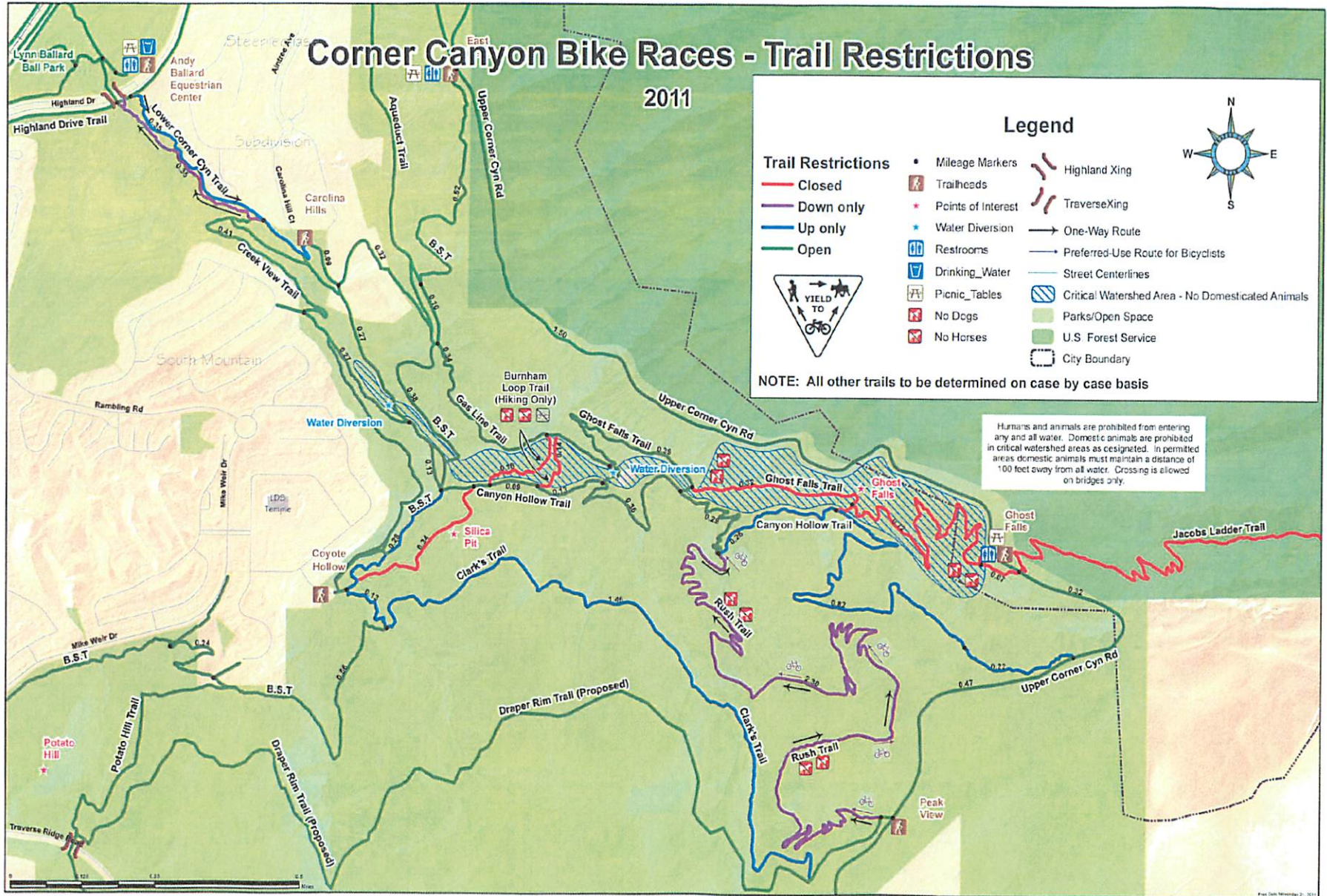
1. The applicant is responsible for the conduct of all event attendees for the duration of the event. Event organizer is required to have one (1) event staff for every 20 participants. If it is a youth event, this requirement is one (1) staff for every 10 youth participants.
2. No activities or events shall interrupt public trail use, and the trail must remain open for the public use for the duration of your event. This includes access to parking lots and trailheads
3. "Trail Marshalls" must be placed strategically along the designated trail use to help warn and protect trail users who are on the trail but not part of the event.
4. Event Organizer is required and responsible for posting notification at all affected trail heads/parking lots two weeks prior to the event. Posting should include date, time, type of event and trails planned to use.

5. Marking of trails more than 48 hours prior to the event is not permitted. Marking the trail with any techniques that cannot be removed immediately after event is not permitted. Examples of non-approved methods are paint, chalk, rock monuments, etc. Examples of approved methods include: removable signs, cones, flagging tape, etc.
6. The permittee is responsible for cleaning and restoring the area and trails after the event. This includes removal of any products or signs brought by organizer to the course/trail and removal and proper disposal of any litter from trails and trail heads.
7. Any flags, banners or signs used at event must conform within the Draper City sign code.
8. Permittee is not allowed to alter or change Draper City trails, remove equipment, add to or take away from the trails including trail berms, banking, construction of jumps, bridge modification, etc. without the written consent of the Parks and Recreation Dept.
9. Motorized vehicles are not permitted on trails for set-up, water stations, etc. without prior permission.
10. Applicant shall provide City Park and Trail rules and regulations to all participants. Violations of rules and regulations by permittee or participants, including during any pre-riding the route, may affect the approval of future events.
11. Bike Event Restrictions in Corner Canyon are as follows:
  - a. Only one weekend (Fri. – Sun.) bike event allowed per month
  - b. Only two weekday (Mon. – Thur.) bike event allowed per month
  - c. Route of any biking event shall comply with current “Trail Restrictions” map.
12. Draper City reserves the right to alter or add terms and conditions as necessary to the permit. This includes the day of and during the event as necessary.
13. Draper City reserves the right to revoke a permit as needed or cancel/postpone an event at City’s digression due to weather, fire or other natural occurrences that make access to trails detrimental or dangerous.

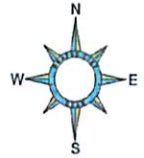

NOTE: All other trails to be determined on case by case basis

Humans and animals are prohibited from entering any and all water. Domestic animals are prohibited in critical watershed areas as designated. In permitted areas domestic animals must maintain a distance of 100 feet away from all water. Crossing is allowed on bridges only.
